


Programme Dates

Academic Programme

Our academic programme is designed to provide a comprehensive and engaging learning experience, blending language acquisition with cultural immersion and creative activities. Over the three weeks, Students will participate in a variety of English lessons, cultural explorations, and STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics) projects. Here's a detailed overview of the weekly schedule and activities:

Week 1: Bridging the Culture Gap

- English Lessons: Topics include meeting and greeting, and transportation systems used around the world.
- Al Workshop.
- CCA Programme: Continues with a variety of co-curricular activities.

Week 2: Adventuring with English

- English Lessons: Focus on travelling to new places and learning in adventurous activities in Australia and New Zealand.
- Al Workshop.
- CCA Programme: Continues with a variety of co-curricular activities.

Throughout the programme, Students will be guided by our dedicated staff, ensuring a supportive and enriching environment. We look forward to a summer of learning, creativity, and cultural exploration!

Co-Curricular Activities (CCAs)

The Co-Curricular Activities (CCAs) offered at our school are carefully structured into two categories: Paid CCAs and Free CCAs. This framework ensures that each student has the opportunity to participate in activities that align with their personal interests, fostering personal growth, skill development, and a comprehensive educational experience throughout their time with us.

Paid Co-Curricular Activities (CCAs)

Swimming (Intermediate & Learn-to-Swim) -

- Two levels are available: Intermediate and Learn-to-Swim
- Each participant will receive a unique Summer Camp Swimming T-shirt, a silicone swim cap, and a drawstring bag.
- Participants will work in small groups, ensuring personalised instruction with a ratio of 1:15 for the Intermediate level and 1:10 for the Learn-to-Swim level.
- A Certificate of Participation will be awarded upon completion.

We are delighted to offer a range of paid Co-Curricular Activities (CCAs) for students during the summer school programme. These activities are led by qualified instructors and are designed to foster skill development, teamwork, and enjoyment. Below are the details for each CCA:

02 Badminton - RM600

- Each student will receive a unique Summer Camp Badminton
 T-shirt and a drawstring bag.
- The class will focus on skill development and game strategies within a small group setting (1:12 ratio).
- A Certificate of Participation will be provided at the end of the programme.

03 K-Pop Dance - RM300

- Students will engage in a workshop focusing on the performance
 of 1-2 songs, which will be showcased on Prize Day.
- The class ratio is 1:20, allowing for both group practice and individual performance development.



Devices/Mobile Phones

Students are permitted to bring their own devices and mobile phones and may access the school WiFi during the summer school programme. The school ensures that sufficient staff are available to supervise and support students, providing a safe and enjoyable experience free from the distraction of devices.

Devices will be accessible during the following times:

- Sunday: From 2:00 PM to 6:30 PM, for a total of 4.5 hours.

Failure to adhere to these timings will result in the earlier collection of devices.  no additional charge.


Celebration Assembly

FACILITIES

KH8 Facilities

The school occupies a campus spanning 10 acres. It is equipped with two dormitory buildings, each consisting of six floors, providing accommodation for a total of 500 students. Both the girls' and boys' dormitories can house 250 students each. The school comprises nine buildings, including 78 classrooms, two libraries, 15 science laboratories, five computer laboratories, an auditorium, four drama rooms, 17 music rooms, six art rooms, a dance room, a recital hall, three discussion rooms, two dining rooms, and 12 study areas. The school's sports facilities include a multi-purpose indoor gymnasium, a football field, an indoor swimming pool, a sports centre, a playground, a gym, a squash court, and a dance studio.



Policies

Pocket Money

For Students joining our summer school, bringing a small amount of pocket money is optional. We recommend not bringing more than MYR1,500. This money can be used to buy toys, snacks, and souvenirs during trips. Please note that all costs for meals and excursions are included in the school fees, so additional pocket money is only needed for personal purchases. We ask that all pocket money is handed in to the Boarding team on arrival. The team will then distribute it as required, ensuring that the money is managed responsibly and safely.

Behaviour Policy

Behaviour expectations

It is our aim that the Summer School is a fun and happy experience for all participating children and we would encourage parents to kindly reinforce messages of sensible behaviour with your child. The Summer School Management will implement behaviour management techniques that include positive guidance, redirection and the setting of clear limits and expectations with the goal of helping each child maintain self-esteem and have respect for others.

The Summer School programme is designed for group participation and interaction. Any behaviour that disrupts programming, endangers self or others, disrespects the property of others or requires repeated one to one attention may result in the child being asked to "sit out" of activities until the situation is resolved. Please also note that should there be any damage caused to school property or the property of any other school attendee, attendees will be charged accordingly.

After speaking with parents or an agent where applicable, if a child continues to be disruptive after repeated guidance and warnings about their behaviour, we reserve the right to remove them from all activities. We see this as a means of last resort for the well-being and safety of all children at summer school.

Please note that the consumption or use of alcohol, cigarettes or vapes is strictly forbidden. If children are carrying or using any of these items, we reserve the right to confiscate them immediately and apply the behavioural guidelines outlined above.

Medical Provision


We are dedicated to ensuring the health and well-being of all students throughout the summer school programme. Our medical team, comprising two qualified nurses, is available during the day to provide care. The San (Sanitary Facility) operates daily from 07:30 to 18:00, with extended hours as needed.

Students who require medical attention will be taken to the San in order to receive an initial assessment and then treatment if required. Should any further treatment be necessary, parents will be informed.

Parents will not be charged for medical provision that is provided by our in-house staff. However, if a student requires additional medical care at an external medical centre, parents or their appointed agents will be responsible for all related costs. A detailed bill will be provided to facilitate insurance claims, if applicable.

Should a child require quarantine, boarding house visits will be made during the day and once at night.

Medication




